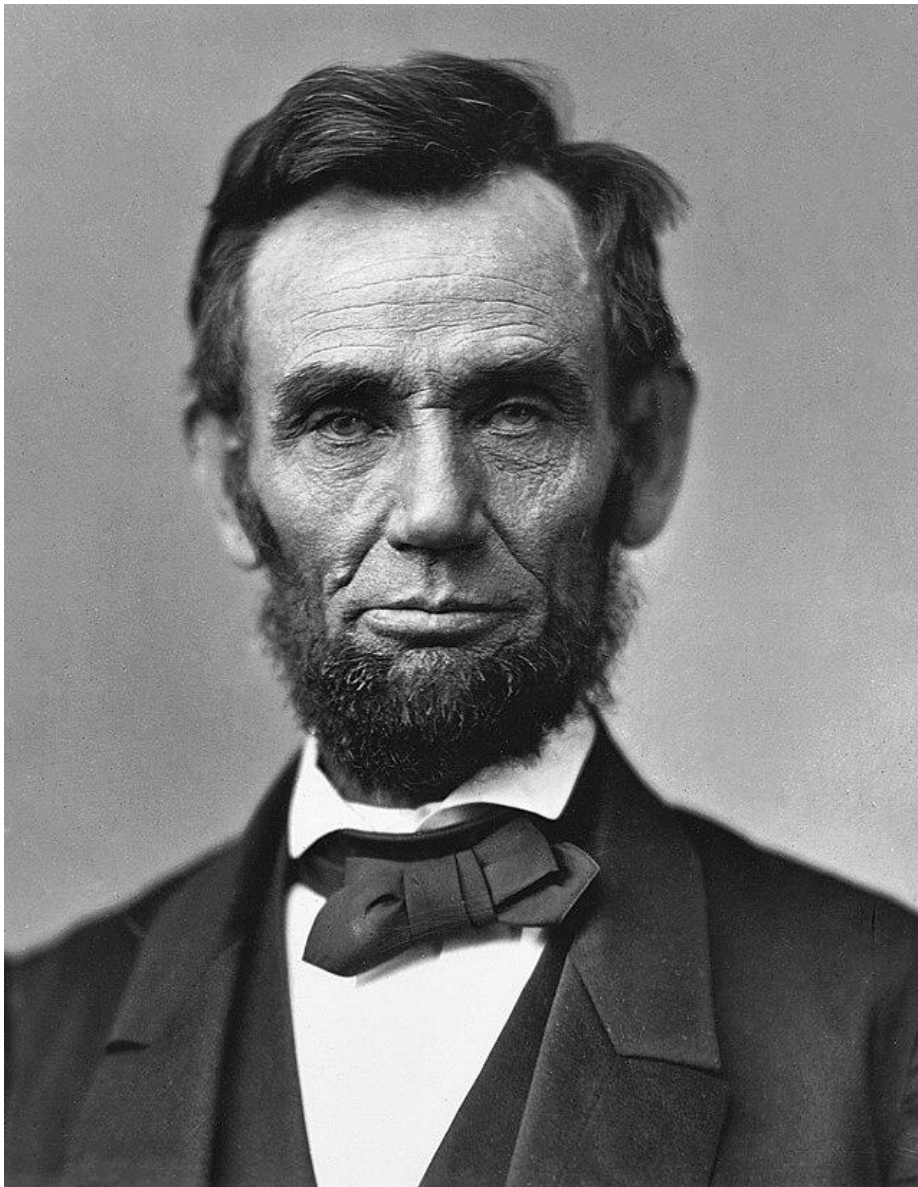


Abraham Lincoln: The Great American Leader
